Do all states observe daylight saving time? Hawaii and most of Arizona don't observe the time change. U.S. territories that don't go on daylight saving time include American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Why do we have it? The idea is to save electricity because there are more hours of natural light. Studies have shown the savings to be fairly nominal—the time change leading people to switch on the lights earlier in the morning instead or cranking up the air conditioning, for example.

Interesting enough, daylight saving time had always been in April—until the Energy Policy Act of 2005 ordered the earlier start time to begin in March 2007.
