KEEP OFF TRACKS

Stay 30ft clear of RR at all times.

No trespassing on rail tracks.Penalty by law.

BE AWARE: A new trail route has been made. A fresh berm has been placed 30ft from the railroad tracks...obviously stay on the side farthest from the tracks. The railroad police will be issuing a fine to anyone caught riding near the tracks. The law implies that we must stay 30 ft clear of the railroad tracks at all times; only crossing the tracks at the designated railroad crossing areas. Please pay attention to signs to avoid the fine. There are signs posted all over the area.


