HUNTING SEASON RIDING RESTRICTIONS

As we enter hunting season, please be aware of **riding restrictions** in place to ensure safety and respect for all land users:

RCTR Riding Restrictions

2025-2026 Season | Due to Hunting Activity

General Riding Restrictions

- No Riding Before 9:00 AM October 4, 2025 January 19, 2026
- No Riding Before 9:00 AM on Sundays October 5 December 7, 2025

Specific Day Restrictions

No Riding Until NOON:

- Saturday, October 4, 2025 Deer (Archery)
- Saturday, October 18, 2025 Black Bear & Deer

No Riding ALL DAY:

- Thursday, October 23, 2025 Deer (Junior/Senior)
- Monday, November 24, 2025 Black Bear
- Saturday, November 29, 2025 Deer (Buck)
- Saturday, December 13, 2025 Deer (Buck)

These dates are posted at the office and at all campground gates. Please plan your rides accordingly and help us maintain a safe environment for everyone.

Under 12 adult supervision... We need to address a growing concern: children under 12 riding unsupervised in the campground.

That means no solo rides, no joyriding near campsites, and no exceptions. What happened? Did certain people forget how to read? I know I personally put it in the newsletter and an email as a reminder. We ask all parents and quardians to take this seriously. These rules are in place to protect your children and your fellow members.

DRY WEATHER DUSTY TRAILS

TIP OF THE DAY

Homemade Laundry Detergent

Ingredients

- 1 Box of Super Washing Soda 3 lb. 7 oz.
- 1 Box of Borax 4 lbs 12 oz. size
- Box of Pure Baking Soda 4 lb.
- 3 bars of Fels-Naptha 5.5 oz. or you could also use Ivory or Zote soap 1 container of Oxy-Clean 1.3 lb (\$3.86)
- *optional: Purex Crystals 28 oz. for scent (or you could use Downy un-stoppables)

Instructions

Finely grate the Fels-Naptha. Mix all the ingredients together and store in container of your choice. Use only 1-2 Tablespoons of detergent per load.

Recipe by Happy Money Saver Homemade Laundry Detergent - costs about \$20.27 to make – can last a whole year or even longer (504 loads) View Park 7pm
