Rausch Creek Trailriders Tarp Policy

To maintain fairness and preserve the integrity of our campsites standards, please follow these tarp and plastic use guidelines:

General Rule: Tarps are not permitted at campsites unless they are temporarily covering recent damage that is actively being repaired. This use may not exceed 7 days.

Winterizing Exception: Tarps may be placed directly on campers for winterization purposes. However, they are **not allowed** around porches, decks, or other campsite structures.

While You're Present: Tarps or clear plastic may be laid down while you are physically at your campsite, but **must be rolled up and removed when you leave.**

Why This Matters: These rules are in place because some members have used tarps and plastic to build hidden structures or create unauthorized storage areas. That is **not permitted.**

Prohibited Materials: Clear plastic sheeting, regular tarps, clear corrugated sheets are also **not allowed**, as they've been used in similar ways to conceal or build unapproved structures.
