The Pump House: Located in the first parking lot on Elena Ave there is a faucet available during the warmer months. We make no representations regarding pot ability. You may use this water to clean your off-road vehicle or vehicle.

Hegins-Hubley Water Authority: For clean water from town. Stop in the office for directions and head on into town. There is a clipboard specifically for the use of RCTR members, please fill the sheet out properly every time!

It's Time to Ride!

Before you head out, make sure you're starting the season prepared and ready for anything the trails throw your way.

Fuel Up: Make sure your gas tank is topped off before you head out. Running out of fuel deep in the woods is never fun — or easy to recover from.

Cell Phone: Always carry a charged phone and

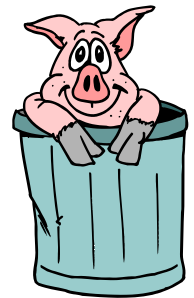
have the office number saved: (570) 682-1075. It's also printed on your helmet sticker. If you're lost, stuck, or hurt, don't hesitate to call. Our emergency line alerts the operations crew immediately, even when the office is closed. Leave as much information as possible, and someone will return your call within a couple of minutes and send the appropriate help.

Gear Check: Helmet, goggles, chest protector, gloves, boots, knee pads, elbow pads, camelback — make sure you've got everything you need for a safe ride.

Tools: Most riders carry basic tools for small repairs like a flat tire or loose chain. A simple kit can save your whole day.

Don't Ride Alone: Always try to have a riding partner. It's safer, smarter, and a lot more fun.

Helmet Stickers: Make sure your membership sticker is **current and visible** on your helmet before heading out.

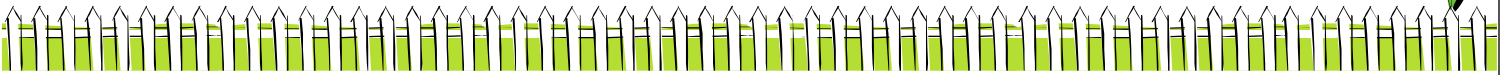

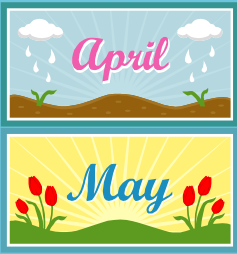


Weather FORECAST
