



HARESCRAMBLE WEEKEND!!



Get ready, RCTR — race weekend is back!

The SPER Hare Scramble returns to Rausch Creek on June 27th and 28th, and the property is about to come alive with two full days of racing action.

Saturday kicks off with the Youth Hare Scrambles from noon to 5pm, and Sunday brings the main event from 10am to 4pm.

To keep everyone safe, several areas will be completely shut down for the weekend:

Trail #2 east of Slate Wall, all trails north of Trail #1 (Whoop Trail), and all trails south of Gap Street from the Open Pit Mining area to the Good Spring intersection.

You can still ride Trail #1, just not past the mine shaft entrance. These closures run Friday through Sunday afternoon, and a map will be posted at the office so you can plan your ride. Spectators are welcome — just park your machines and walk in, or if you want to catch the start or hang out in the pit area located at the old Rally Bear Valley area, you'll need to go by regular vehicle via the Summit Quarry haul road near Joliett, sign the waiver, and pay \$10 per person.

Please stay clear of all course markings — tape, stakes, arrows — because even lifting a piece of yellow tape can ruin critical warnings for racers. **And remember:** absolutely no riding on the race course until the event is over on Sunday.

Thanks for rolling with the closures and helping us make another awesome race weekend happen!

Policy Reminder — Safety & Courtesy

Campground Speed — SLOW means *slow*. The speed limit is **5 MPH**. Anything over 30 MPH is dangerous, kicks up dust, and puts kids, pets, and other riders at risk.

Quiet Hours — Please keep noise down from **10 PM–7 AM** so everyone can rest.

Helmet Rule — Helmets must be worn and strapped any time you're riding. No exceptions.

Guest Rules — Members are responsible for their guests at all times, including behavior and rule compliance.

Dumpster Use — Two-bag limit per campsite. Household trash only. No large items, furniture, tires, or construction debris.

Tarp Policy — Tarps allowed only for temporary repairs (7 days) or winterizing campers. Not permitted on decks, porches, or as makeshift walls.

Lately it feels like a few folks have forgotten that other humans exist on this planet. We've seen some real "I'm the only person here" moments — the kind where someone barrels through the campground or ignores rules like they're optional side quests. So here's your friendly nudge: let's bring back basic awareness. Look around. Notice people. Pretend we all share the same world (because... we do).
