

Share the Good Time

With the season in full swing, we thought it would be helpful to highlight a few key things that are important for everyone to have the best, safest time. (Most of them as told to us by members.)

Operations Staff is available 24 hours. On weekends coverage is by members and paid staff like you who are in the campground, and during the week it is staff probably coming from home. Either way the regular office number's emergency message system (570-682-1075) calls us to tell us you've left a message.

Campires must be small and contained and never left unattended. We have retrofitted a water buggie and obtained "Indian Tanks" to provide reasonable first-response capability. None of this does any good if you are asleep or out and about and don't see that your fire is roasting more than your weenies.

The #1 complaint by far from members is bad behavior in the campground. So remember...

Camp Roads are not a playground. Observe the speed limit and do not ever spin your wheels, raise a wheel off the ground or ride through anyone's campsite.

Children riding unattended, even just around the campground, are at risk of serious injury and frequently forget the preceding rules, annoying many members to no end. All operations staff have been instructed to escort any children under the age of 12 found riding unattended back to their guardian. The second such incident will result in the children being "parked" for the remainder of the day.

Quiet hours in the campground start at 10:00. Turn down your music, dial back your voices, and if your generator is louder than 65db you must turn it off.

As always, if you feel that the behavior of another member isn't in the spirit of being considerate or safe you are not only permitted but expected to let us know so we can resolve issues amicably. You won't be identified and in our experience most members are really easy to get along with anyway. They typically stop whatever they are doing wrong when they are made aware of the impact their behavior is having on other members. We are glad to do so.



Eggs on the Grill?

"Have you ever tried eggs on the grill by using a muffin pan? Just spray the pan and crack the eggs and put them on the grill. Try adding some chopped peppers and onions or anything to your liking."

- Preheat grill for medium high heat and lightly oil grate.
