

## Comfortable Fall

Continue your cautiousness as sicknesses and the dreaded COVID 19 virus are rising with the cooler weather. The most effective way to protect yourself is by frequent hand cleaning with alcohol-based rub or washing them with soap and water, as well as, wearing a mask.

Contact tracing will be conducted for close contacts (any individual within 6 feet of an infected person for a total of 15 minutes or more) of laboratory-confirmed or probable COVID-19 patients. Asymptomatic contacts (i.e., close encounter with confirmed or probable COVID-19 case) testing negative should self-quarantine for 14 days from their last exposure.

With the onset of Autumn weather, you may be tempted to start dropping your guard against ticks, but did you know that the late summer and early autumn is the peak time for pesky parasites such as ticks. Ticks generally live in wooded area, grass, bushes, undergrowth, and clearings, but can also be found anywhere there is grass. Ticks are unable to jump so rely on animals and people to brush past so they can attach and feed. Once the ticks attach to an animal or human they remain in place feeding for up to 3 days, they only fall off once they are engorged. How to remove a tick? It is important to make sure the mouth part of the tick is removed along with the body. You should never try to pull, squeeze or burn the tick to remove it. Specially designed tick removers are really effective.
