TIP OF THE DAY Campfire Baked Apples

—Apples: 1 per camper (or 2 if you've got big eaters!) —Butter —Optional filling: dried fruit, caramel dip, walnuts, pecans, Craisins, brown sugar, cinnamon, crumbled shortbread cookies Spray a sheet of aluminum foil about 8 inches long with cooking spray, or brush with a bit of softened butter. Core the apples and fill the centers with your filling. Place a dollop of butter on filling and cover with the aluminum foil. Put these apples on a cooking grate over the fire or near hot embers if you don't have a grate. Do not put the apples directly in the fire! Let the apples roast for 20-30 minutes.
