1.Cell Phone - You should always carry a cell phone and have the office number (570)682-1075...the # is on your helmet sticker. Please don't hesitate to give us a call if you are lost or stuck. Our emergency line is set up to reach the operations crew immediately even if the office is closed.

2.Got ALL your gear? Helmet. Tools? - Most riders can carry basic tools to repair a flat tire or other minor repair on the trail. Riding partner? - It's never a good idea to ride alone. Always try to have a riding partner. Stickers? - Make sure your sticker is up to date on your helmet.

3. Review the latest email for campground reminders.

4. Take it easy through the campground. SLOW SLOW SLOW driving and riding. The city lights are behind you and the country air is here...it's time to SLOW down and relax.

5. Review quiet hour rules. Respect others by lowering voices and music during quiet hours 10pm-7am...voices and music carry in the still of night, so be respectful of this time. This goes for daytime as well. Keep it to a respectable level or it's going to be NO LEVEL.
